Located just north of Orlando along Interstate 4, Longwood is the oldest city in Seminole County. It was founded in 1878 and named after a fashionable Boston suburb.

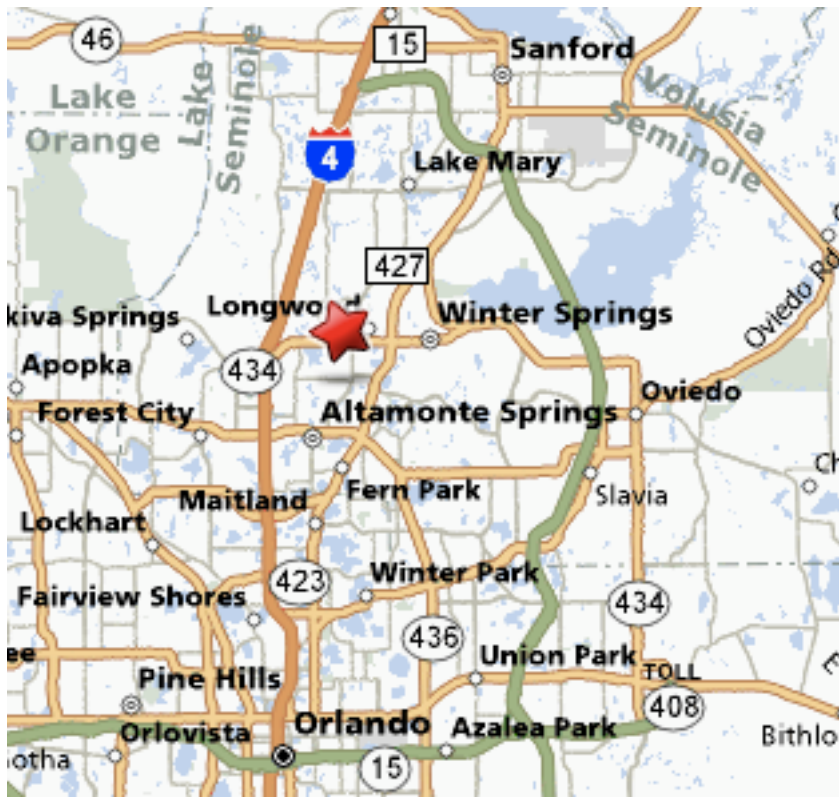
As business and tourism grew, the City became known as the “Friendly Crossroads.”
